NOTE: The 23rd Annual Bear on the Square is dedicated to the memory of Grant Searcey. The popular local artist was a "fan" of Bear on the Square for many years. He regularly donated original art to our fundraising auction, and in 2017 and 2018 produced the artwork for our t-shirts and posters. Thanks to his wife Mindy for sharing these words with us.

On Saturday, October 27, 2018, Grant passed away at the age of 42.

Grant had a passion for painting and creative expression. He also loved the water, and he combined his two favorite things to create imaginative and whimsical fun art. His paintings of various sea creatures and unique characters were much admired not only by friends and family, but by all who purchased his

artwork from shows and galleries around the country. He was a social genius, good human being and friend to every person he encountered. He was known for his positive attitude, creativity, infectious smile, and his kind and compassionate spirit. Grant gave us many things to remember in our journey.

Always look at art with an open heart and perceive what you feel in the moment without doubt. This is YOUR truth. Know it and trust it as it will not lead you astray.

Laugh as much as you can at life. It's complicated. You can be beat down by it or you can create something beautiful with it. The choice is completely yours.

HOW OUR FESTIVAL GOT ITS NAME

Dahlonega's Bear on the Square has been a local legend since 1996, going back to the time when a bear cub took refuge in the sycamore tree in front of Brad Walker's pottery studio on the north side of the square.

The story began on a spring morning when a mama bear with two cubs made her way into the town's historic square, causing a "big commotion." The mama bear and one cub apparently escaped from town. The other cub, however, decided to climb the sycamore tree, where it remained for several hours.

The Forest Service rangers eventually coaxed the cub down from the tree and delivered it unharmed back into the mountain woodlands.


Followed the bears' Dahlonega adventure, several local residents began kicking around the idea of throwing a "party" to give a boost to local business during a slow time for business, and this ultimately led to what is now the Bear on the Square Festival.

Glenda Pender, a Bear on the Square Mountain Festival founder who is president of the festival organization, remembers that "the visit of the bears caused so much excitement and so much buzz around town that we thought it was a perfect opportunity to usher in spring with an authentic Appalachian festival while we celebrated the occasion."

The group considered as the founders of the festival include Glenda and Nick Pender, Dianne Quigley, Gloria and Dick Smithers, and Hal Williams. The first annual Bear on the Square Mountain Festival took place in 1997, and over the years, the event has evolved into an incredible weekend of music and art around the picturesque Public Square in Dahlonega.

If you look up into the sycamore tree today you will see a wooden bear cub attached to the tree in celebration of that 1996 event.
