WORKSHOPS AND JAMS


- Appalachian Music and Dance (Barry Whittemore) Explore an introduction to the history of music and dance in the Appalachians.
- Appalachian Sung Stories (Hannah Sage From) Hear beautiful ballads, discover the history, and sing a ballad or two.
- Ballad Singing (Sarrah Ellen McDonald) Sarrah Ellen will share unaccompanied ballads learned from family members. Don't miss her powerful and expressive singing!
- **Basics of Banjo** (Josiah Tyree) Explore everything from Clawhammer to Three-Finger Style with contest-winning Josiah Tyree.
- Children's Book Reading Hour: UNG students will read from seven children's books that they wrote, illustrated, and published as part of an English class. (Readers 6-10 but all are welcome!)
- **Clogging** (Andy Howard) Come prepared to dance and learn some basic steps! No experience necessary.
- Foundations of Bluegrass Guitar (Reuben Agnew) From Northern Ireland, Reuben has studied with world-class artists and has become one of the top bluegrass guitar players in the UK and Ireland.
- Guitar for Singers (Joe Newberry) Great for pickers who like to sing, and vice versa.
- Mandolin Technique (David Benedict) David is one of the leading figures and content creators in the mandolin world. He has received two IBMA awards and was nominated for a Grammy. He teaches

full-time and performs regularly.

- New(ish) Old-Time Tunes for All (Andy Howard) Atlanta fiddler and clogger Andy Howard will teach some of his favorite recent tunes and introduce you to a few of the folks who are producing great new old-time tunes today.
- Old-Time Fiddle (Max Godfrey & Maggie Hall) Join Max and Maggie as they break down some cool fiddle tunes you might not have learned before!
- **Old-Time Mandolin** (Brennan Breed) Brennan will share mandolin tunes and techniques appropriate for all levels.
- **Performing as a Duo** (Max Godfrey & Maggie Hall) Learn the ins and outs of vocal harmony, backup fiddle, guitar runs, and improvisation.
- Sacred Harp Singing (Esther Morgan-Ellis) You will be provided with a brief introduction to the history and practice of Sacred Harp singing and then have an opportunity to sing some favorite songs.
- **Song & Tune Writing** (John Grimm) This champion fiddle and banjo player with a growing catalog of albums will introduce his approach to writing new songs and tunes in an old-time style.

FESTIVAL DEDICATIONS DAVE A MOSER

Dave's musical career began as a boy when he was a member of the

Atlanta Boy Choir. As an adult, he learned to play the banjo and enjoyed playing with other musicians. The Atlanta Area Friends of Folk Music was organized as an old-time music group in Atlanta, and Dave became the resident sound guy when they hosted concerts for visiting musicians.

When he moved to the Dahlonega area, it was just natural for Dave to move into doing sound for Bear on the Square. He also spent time jamming with other musicians. He loved the local music scene and his musician friends, as well as the musicians who come to Bear every year. He was a dedicated volunteer for Bear, serving on the festival committee for many years. He became affectionately known as Uncle Dave and his workshop tent at Bear (Uncle Dave's Tent) was a popular spot.

Dave passed away June 21, 2023.



ALICE SAMPSON

Over the past 20+ years Alice has supported Bear on the Square in

many ways. As the founder and director of the Georgia Appalachian Studies Center at UNG, Alice forged a partnership for the Center to sponsor the festival's Artist Marketplace which continued for several years. She was keenly interested in art and supporting the artists was important to her.

Alice was also an energetic volunteer for the festival's Friday night auction for many years.

As one of the founders of the Georgia Pick & Bow Traditional Music School, Alice helped build the relationship between Bear on the Square and Georgia Pick and Bow from which the music program continues to benefit.

Alice was enthusiastic about the music, the art, the people and the community-building value of Bear on the Square.

Alice passed away Sept. 29, 2023.
